CCR Townsville - 2 prayer groups: Townsville (40 members), Mt Isa (15-20 members), 1 Intercessory Group, and 1 Bible Study Group

CCR Cairns - 3 prayer groups: Cairns, Edmonton, and Tully

Queensland Service Committee Meeting

In Queensland, members of each diocese come together for a yearly weekend meeting in Brisbane. We have been working towards unity, vision and communication. We had moved forward in agreement, and the Lord had blessed this unity. Psalm 133:1.3. Happenings over Queensland since last Brisbane AGM

COVID-19 brought all planned activities to a halt in March this year. All prayer groups went into lockdown and isolation according to Government regulations. Our diaries were suddenly empty and we were brought to our knees in intercessory prayer. Lockdown was also a time of grace. During this time, every diocese sought other means of communication towards staying connected by encouraging members and sharing stories through phone calls and social media. Zoom became a new way of spiritual connection for prayer, formation and spiritual renewal. Some prayer groups continued to meet in this way. Members joined amazing spiritual recourses through virtual Masses, CHARIS Pentecost Vigil, Pentecost Pilgrimage, 'live out retreats', and teaching through U tube.

CCR Brisbane

President Audrey Chan-Seow has presented the report for Brisbane so I will not include it again here. I will just give a mention to the **Healing Prayer Centres**, as I am the coordinator of this ministry.

COVID-19 had a devastating effect on our **Healing Prayer Centres**, which operate under Brisbane Archdiocese. Many prayer appointments had to be cancelled. The waiting list continued to grow in number until finally we received permission to operate through Zoom media. Then as restrictions eased, we have been able to operate through 'face to face' ministry. **Prayer appointments since August 10 last year are 79**, (20 less in number from last year). Unfortunately, due to fresh outbreaks in Brisbane, we will only continue through Zoom and WhatsApp media until conditions change.

CCR Toowoomba is running a marathon—a slow and steady run—as the tent of **Isaiah 54:2.4** is being stretched within the diocese. Much prayer and work has been fruitful with the establishment of a Diocesan Service Committee along with a Mission Statement. Committee provides CCR articles for quarterly diocesan publications. Members continue to work towards expansion into other towns in the Toowoomba Diocese; without success at this point, but hopeful for a fruitful future. Bp McGuckin has been a source of encouragement and support.

'Wings of Freedom' Toowoomba Prayer Group

- Members host monthly Parish Masses with morning tea, offering prayer ministry after Mass
- New ministry unfolding 'Outreach to the Aged' ministry of praise/worship in Aged Care Centres
- There is a desire to set up a prayer group for Mum's with children
- 7 members attended Healing Prayer Training at CCR Brisbane Centre

CCR Rockhampton

Coordinating team meets three times yearly for discussion and prayer, with Bishop Michael McCarthy attending if possible. All groups have been given the challenge to rise up and to be prepared to offer to parishes what they have received. Since numbers for gatherings have been increased **some prayer groups have been gathering in homes.**

- Members committed to Praise/Worship/Teaching/Prayer ministry
- Working towards raising new leaders and strengthening older members
- Contact has been made with a prayer group in Mackay
- Encouraging another group in Rockhampton with younger people

Rockhampton Yearly Conference was cancelled due to COVID-19

CCR Townsville

Members of Townsville prayer group have developed a 3-year plan with vision and goals of developing young people towards spiritual leadership. Since numbers for gathering has increased **prayer group has been gathering in homes.**

- Townsville Regional Conference with presenter Shayne Bennett will go ahead on 7th-9th August
- Endeavouring to establish new prayer groups, especially in Ayr
- Focussed on expansion and outreach in both Catholic and Ecumenical Churches
- Serving local parish and giving attendances to Ecumenical Church events

CCR Cairns

Leadership is focused on weekly Prayer Group meetings, Intercessory Prayer, monthly Healing Masses, and the hosting of an annual CCR Conference. Numbers are small with much being accomplished when the whole Diocesan Team works together.

- CCR Cairns Conference was cancelled due to COVID-19
- Contact has been made with a group meeting in Mareeba
- Support given to Community of the Risen Lord

Raising the Profile of CCR in Queensland

Every member of the State Service Committee has committed to the vision and scripture of Isaiah 54:2.4 and are prayerfully listening to the Lord for direction, stirring up the gifts of the Spirit, and seeking to become a mighty army. The Lord is stretching and strengthening us, preparing and positioning us for 'mission and ministry to mainstream Church'. COVID-19 may have put us in the trenches where we are safe and comfortable, but we will not stay there. Our time of isolation has given us time for spiritual renewal by being infused with supernatural power, impassioned by the Holy Spirit to step out into the open by witnessing to our faith through Baptism in the Holy Spirit. National Service of Communion for Family of Catholic Charismatic Renewal

As Queensland State President, I represent the State of Queensland on the **National Service of Communion** (NSoC) representing CHARIS in Australia. The Holy Father Pope Francis, called for this implementation of CHARIS in order that all Charismatic Communities and Realities worldwide would unite as one family and serve as 'One Stream of Grace' to assist the Church in Her Mission of Evangelisation and Healing. CHARIS internationally was launched at Pentecost last year.

Members of the NSoC are in 'transition' stage as we are yet to have elections of members and official paperwork set up for Australia. Shayne Bennett as Oceania Representative for CHARIS, led a meeting in November last year with members represented from Emmanuel Community, Servants of Jesus Community, Bread of Life Community (Catholic branch of Servants), Disciples of Jesus, School of Evangelisation, Flame Ministries, Youth Representation, Prayer Groups represented by leaders of each State and Territory; Fr Ken Barker (MGL) was also present and a member representing New Zealand. Since then, other communities and spiritual organisations have been contacted in each State and Territory and made aware of CHARIS, and have been encouraged to join internationally at an invitation to attend an official platform for the launch of CHARIS in Australia.

The platform for the launch of CHARIS was planned at end of April in Sydney this year. **Due to COVID-19** this needed to be cancelled. At this time, the launch is booked for November this year but it is uncertain if this will go ahead. We will be having a **Zoom meeting during August,** and we will all know a little more after discussion and deliberation.

Catholic Charismatic Renewal internationally has been given the expectation of **Pope Francis** and there is much to be achieved by the power of the Holy Spirit, and with the public support of Pope Francis, can go from strength to strength. It **rests with each of us** to give Pope Francis every reason to continue his support and encouragement, by uniting as **'One Stream of Grace'** and to serve the Church more fully through **Catholic Charismatic Renewal** as 'we enlarge the site of our tents, lengthen our cords and strengthen our stakes, trusting that we will spread out to the right and to the left and that our descendants will possess the nations and will settle the desolate towns'.
